#### Quality & Research Corner with Chloe Lee, OARC's Evaluation & Quality Specialist



As we shared in our <u>May issue</u>, OARC is currently engaged in a 2-year research project that will lead to the co-development of a toolkit/resource for long-term care homes to facilitate resident involvement in their home operations. The first phase of this work – also known as our 'scoping review' – is nearing completion now. This process involved a thorough review of existing research literature, followed by the extraction of relevant excerpts from 70 of the articles we reviewed. The types of articles that met our criteria included examples of how residents have been effectively engaged in home-level decisions in the past.

To showcase our project work to date, OARC will be participating in a poster presentation at <a href="CAG2023: Toronto">CAG2023: Toronto</a>, the national conference hosted by the Canadian Association of Gerontology on October 27<sup>th</sup>.

The next phase of our project with involve direct consultation with residents and their supportive partners in long-term care in the form of exploratory conversational interviews. We'll look forward to sharing more details and inviting your participation in an upcoming issue of OARC in Action!

#### Federal Consultation – Safe Long-Term Care Act

On July 21, the federal government released a <u>public online consultation</u> to inform the development of a Safe Long-Term Care Act - a proposed piece of legislation led by the Liberal government to ensure nationwide standards for long-term care homes. OARC Resident Leaders will be participating in a private consultation to help inform the proposed legislation. The consultation is open until September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

### RESEARCH STUDY OPPORTUNITY: Exploring the Experience of Francophones in Long-Term Care and Home Care

In recent weeks, the OARC team has been hearing from residents that have shared that their homes are starting to experience COVID-19 outbreaks.
